



# RED REHABILITATION ENABLES DREAMS

RED is dedicated to keeping people out of the criminal justice system - permanently - through pre-adjudication programs that support the **Social, Civic, Financial, and Digital** literacy of individuals referred to court.



## Our Restorative Justice Program

Over 12 months, participants develop life skills through an evidence-based digital curriculum, task-oriented learning, engaging workshops, & guidance from mentors that treat them as **students**, not **criminals**.
